MILTON TOWNSHIP ANNUAL MEETING
Meeting Minutes
April 8, 2025

The Annual Meeting of Milton Township, Count of DuPage was held at the Wheaton Park District Community Center, Wheaton, Illinois, on April 8, 2025, at 7:00PM.

That meeting was called to order by Milton Township Clerk, Yadav Nathwani at 7:00 P.M. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Clerk Nathwani introduced the elected officials followed by a brief speech explaining the purpose of the meeting and resolutions presented for approval.

The first order of business was a call by the Clerk for nominations of a Moderator for the Annual Meeting. A Township Elector nominated Sean Conway to serve as moderator, which was seconded by another Township Elector. No other nominations were presented and the nominations were closed. Sean Conway was unanimously elected Moderator by voice vote.

Clerk Nathwani administered the oath of Moderator to Mr. Sean Conway who then conducted the meeting.

Sean Conway welcomed everyone to the 176th Annual Township Meeting. Mr. Conway introduced himself and provided some introductory remarks.

Mr. Conway explained that as Moderator he is required to preside over the meeting; conduct the business of the meeting, as expressed on the Agenda; and preserve and decide all questions of order. The Township Board approved the Agenda earlier in the year. Copies of the Agenda and the meeting minutes of April 9, 2024, were made available for all attendees of this meeting.

A Township Elector moved, seconded by another Township Elector, to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to approve the Minutes of April 9, 2024. There being no further discussion, the motion passed by voice vote.

The next order of business was the consideration of the proposed Resolutions.

A Township Elector moved, seconded by another Township Elector, to approve the resolution entitled, "Authorizing Certain Powers to the Township Board". Moderator Conway called for discussion. There being no further discussion, the resolution entitled, "Authorizing Certain Powers to the Township Board" passed by voice vote.

A Township Elector moved, seconded by another Township Elector to approve the resolution entitled, "Fixing Hour for the Township Meeting". Moderator Conway called for discussion. There being no further discussion, the motion passed by voice vote.

Resolution Summaries

PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION NO. 1:

“RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CERTAIN POWERS TO THE BOARD”

This is a standard Resolution presented to the Electors every year, as required by the Town Code. The Resolution covers miscellaneous and unusual situations which may come up during the Calendar Year. If the Town Board cannot act in these situations, a Special Town Meeting must be held.

No changes to the Electors’ powers are being proposed which would give the Town Board the authority to change Tax Rates.

PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION NO. 2:

“FIXING HOUR FOR TOWNSHIP MEETINGS”

The Township Electors determine the hour for Annual and Special Township Meetings. This Resolution sets 7:00 p.m. as the hour to begin the Annual Meetings and 6:00 p.m. as the hour to begin the monthly Town Board Meetings and any Special Town Meetings during the next Calendar Year.

PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION NO. 3:

SPECIAL POLICE

The Town Board has evaluated the funds and the expenditures in the Special Police District Fund and has determined that the Township can provide all of the necessary Police and Public Safety measures required in such an amount that warrants a reduction in the Special Police District Fund. The existing Funds in the Special Police District Funds will be transferred to the Capital Fund to address the needs of the Residents of the Township. Transfers between Funds requires the action of the Electors.

PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION NO. 4:

Mosquito

The Town Board has evaluated the funds and the expenditures in the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Misquito Abatement Fund and has determined that the Township can provide all of the measures necessary for mosquito abatement in such an amount that warrants a reduction in the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Misquito Abatement Fund. A portion of the Funds in the existing Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Misquito Abatement Fund will be transferred to the Capital Fund to address the needs of the Residents of the Township. Transfers between Funds requires the action of the Electors.

RESOLUTION
AUTHORIZING CERTAIN POWERS TO THE TOWNSHIP BOARD

April 14, 2026

WHEREAS, Illinois law grants certain powers to the electors at the Annual Township Meeting; and

WHEREAS, the electors by law may take all necessary measures and give directions for the exercise of their corporate powers (60 ILCS 1/30-25), and

WHEREAS, the Township Board is familiar with the day-to-day operations of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township Board meets monthly, or more often; and

WHEREAS, necessary actions are required throughout the year;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the electors present at this Milton Township Annual Meeting that the Milton Township Board be granted authority to act for the residents of Milton Township in the following instances.

(1) To expend monies for the preparation, establishment, and maintenance of a detailed property record system to provide information useful to assessment officials. Such record system shall be available to all assessing officials. The property record system shall include up-to-date and complete tax maps except where those maps are otherwise already available or ordered, ownership lists, valuation standards, and property record cards, including appraisals, for all or any part of the property in the township in accordance with and shall not limit the powers and duties of assessing officials (60 ILCS 1/30-45). reasonable rules and procedures prescribed by the Department of Revenue. The system and records shall not be considered to be assessments

(2) To purchase real estate or personal property for public purposes; and to sell, dispose of, convey, regulate, or use of the township's real and personal property that may be deemed conducive to the best interests of the Township (60 ILCS 1/30-50).

(3) To appropriate monies, in excess of the sum provided in the Public Graveyards Act, for the purpose of putting any old, neglected graves and cemeteries in the township in a cleaner and more respectable condition (60 ILCS 1/30-60).

(4) To provide space in any township building for courtroom and office use by the Circuit Court (60 ILCS 1/30-70).

(5) To provide for the decoration and maintenance of graves of persons who at any time served in the armed forces of the United States that are within the township (60 ILCS 1/30-65).

(6) To exercise the powers conferred by the "Township Zoning Act" except or otherwise provided by law (60 ILCS 1/30-75).

(7) To offer premiums and take actions to induce the planting and cultivating of trees along the highways in the township, and to preserve trees standing along or on highways, and to purchase, plant, and cultivate trees along the streets and highways in the township (60 ILCS 1/30-85).

(8) To make rules and regulations for ascertaining the sufficiency of all fences in the township and to determine what is a lawful fence within the township except as otherwise provided by law (60 ILCS 1/30-90).

(9) To restrain, regulate, or prohibit the running at large of cattle, horses, mules, asses, swine, sheep, or goats and to determine the time and manner in which those animals may go at large, unless they are restrained from running at large in some manner provided by law (60 ILCS 1/30-95).

(10) To establish and maintain pounds at places within the township that are deemed necessary and convenient and to discontinue any pounds within the township. When a pound is erected, it shall be under the care and direction of a pound master (60 ILCS 1/30-100). The Township Board may appoint pound masters (60 ILCS 1/30-105).

(11) To authorize the distraining, impounding, and sale of cattle, horses, mules, asses, swine, sheep, and goats for penalties incurred and the costs of the proceeding, and to authorize the impounding of dogs found running at large and provide for their destruction at the end of a reasonable period of time if they are not claimed and the cost of impounding paid. (60 ILCS 1/30-110).

(12) To construct and keep in repair public wells or other watering places and to regulate the use of those wells and watering places (60 ILCS 1/30-115).

(13) To prevent the deposit of night soil, garbage, or other offensive substances within the limits of the township. This does not apply to refuse disposal facilities regulated by the Illinois Department of Public Health and DuPage County (60 ILCS 1/30-120).

(14) To adopt ordinances regulating the standing or parking of vehicles on township roads within the township (60 ILCS 1/30-125).

(15) To declare by ordinance inoperable motor vehicles, whether on public or private property, to be a nuisance and to authorize fines to be levied for the failure of any person to obey a notice from the township stating that the person is to dispose of any inoperable motor vehicles under his or her control. To authorize a law enforcement agency with applicable jurisdiction to remove, after 7 days from the issuance of the township notice, any inoperable motor vehicle or parts of such a vehicle (60 ILCS 1/30-130). 60 ILCS 1/30-130 (b) and (c) define an "inoperable motor vehicle."

(16) To authorize the licensing and regulation and direct the location of all places of business of purchasers, traders, and dealers in junk, rags, and any second hand article, including motor vehicles, except in cities, villages, and incorporated towns in the township that by ordinance provide for the licensing, regulation, or location of places of business of those purchasers, traders, and dealers (60 ILCS 1/30-135).

(17) To regulate hawkers, peddlers, pawnbrokers, itinerant merchants, and transient vendors of merchandise. The township board may require that any such person register his or her name and the name of any firm he or she represents with the township clerk and may make reasonable restrictions of the hours during which he or she may engage in door-to-door solicitation. The township board may prohibit the activities of any categories of persons as it determines to be in the best interest of township residents. Any regulation under this Section shall not apply within the boundaries of a city, village, or incorporated town (60 ILCS 1/30-140).

(18) To provide mental health services, including services for the alcoholic, the drug addicted, and the intellectually disabled, for residents of the township by disbursing existing funds if available by contracting with mental health agencies approved by the Department of Human Services, alcoholism treatment programs licensed by the Department of Public Health, and drug abuse facilities and other alcohol and drug abuse services approved by the Department of Human Services except or otherwise provided by law (60 ILCS 1/30-145). To be eligible to receive township funds, an agency, program, facility, or other service provider must have been in existence for more than one year and must serve the township area.

(19) To contract with the DuPage County Sheriff to furnish police protection in the unincorporated areas (60 ILCS 1/30-155).

(20) To provide for fire protection in unincorporated areas except or otherwise provided by law (60 ILCS 1/30-165).

(21) To make all by-laws, rules, and regulations deemed necessary to carry into effect the powers granted above and to impose fines deemed proper, except when a fine or penalty is already allowed by law. No offense shall be classified in excess of a petty offense (60 ILCS 1/30-190).

(22) To apply all penalties, when collected, in the manner deemed most to the interest of the township (60 ILCS 1/30-195).

(23) To use general road and bridge funds for the purpose of collecting, transporting and disposing of brush and leaves generated from those properties contiguous to roads as defined by Section 2-103 of the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/2-103).

(24) To use general road and bridge funds and town funds to be used for the purpose of providing disaster relief and support services approved by the Township Board of Trustees at a regularly scheduled or special meeting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such actions by the Township Board will be implemented only after the Township Board determines that such action is in the best interest of Milton Township residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution will remain in effect until rescinded or modified by the electors at an Annual or Special Township Meeting.

**AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE SPECIAL POLICE DISTRICT
FUND TO THE CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND
MILTON TOWNSHIP
DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, 60 ILCS 1/245-5 authorizes the legal voters of a township at an annual township meeting or a special township meeting called for that purpose to transfer surplus amounts from a township fund to any other township fund; and

WHEREAS, the estimated amount of proper and necessary charges and expenses of Milton Township against the Special Police District Fund from the date of this Annual Town Meeting until the time of receipt of revenue after the Milton Township Annual Town Meeting in April 2027 is \$333,500.00; and

WHEREAS, there exists in the Special Police District Fund a surplus, in the amount of \$539,023.00 over and above the amount necessary to meet Township charges and expenses until the time of receiving revenue after the Milton Township Annual Town Meeting in April 2027; and

WHEREAS the electors of Milton Township desire to transfer surplus funds from the Special Police District Fund to the Capital Projects Fund.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Electors of Milton Township assembled at the 2026 Annual Town Meeting of Milton Township, DuPage County, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The above recitals are incorporated into this Section One as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO: It is hereby directed that surplus fund the amount of \$324,773.00

in the Special Police District Fund of Milton Township

be transferred to the Capital Projects Fund of Milton Township, DuPage County.

PASSED THIS 14th day of April, 2026 by a majority of the Electors present and voting at the Annual Town Meeting, Milton Township, DuPage County, Illinois.

**AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE CONSOLIDATED
MILTON/GLEN ELLYN MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT FUND TO THE CAPITAL
PROJECTS FUND
MILTON TOWNSHIP
DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, 60 ILCS 1/245-5 authorizes the legal voters of a township at an annual township meeting or a special township meeting called for that purpose to transfer surplus amounts from a township fund to any other township fund; and

WHEREAS, the estimated amount of proper and necessary charges and expenses of Milton Township against the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Mosquito Abatement District Fund from the date of this Annual Town Meeting until the time of receipt of revenue after the Milton Township Annual Town Meeting in April 2027 is \$211,320.00; and

WHEREAS, there exists in the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Mosquito Abatement District Fund a surplus in the amount of \$602,544.00 over and above the amount necessary to meet Township charges and expenses until the time of receiving revenue after the Milton Township Annual Town Meeting in April 2027; and

WHEREAS the electors of Milton Township desire to transfer surplus funds from the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Mosquito Abatement District Fund to the Capital Projects Fund.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Electors of Milton Township assembled at the 2026 Annual Town Meeting of Milton Township, DuPage County, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The above recitals are incorporated into this Section One as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO: It is hereby directed that surplus fund the amount of \$ 494,171.00

in the Consolidated Milton/Glen Ellyn Mosquito Abatement District Fund of Milton Township be transferred to the Capital Projects Fund of Milton Township, DuPage County.

PASSED THIS 14th day of April, 2026 by a majority of the Electors present and voting at the Annual Town Meeting, Milton Township, DuPage County, Illinois.
